Dear Teachers,

Would you give *just one dollar* to save a life? Most of us would.

Would you help an organization save millions of lives, through millions of contributions of *just one dollar*? ODFL is that organization. It stands for “One Dollar For Life”.

ODFL asks every high school student in America to give *just one dollar*. It then uses that money to build projects that help students in the developing world.

In just three ODFL has built nine schools, in Kenya, Malawi, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Nepal, and Indonesia. It has bought desks for students in Malawi and cows to feed protein to orphans in Kenya. It has sent used bicycles to Botswana, and bought piglets so that girls in Nepal didn't have to be sold into slavery.

The best part is that ODFL was started and is still operated by teachers and students themselves. It receives foundation funding to cover expenses so *every dollar a student gives goes into a developing world project*.

What's the possibility? If every American high school student gives *just one dollar*, we can build more than 1,000 schools a year in the developing world! It's literally a “change the world” idea *and it's working*.

The message for students here at home is equally powerful: you CAN be a bigger person by helping someone else. You CAN help make the world a better place. If we can instill that belief in millions of America's teenagers we WILL change the world.

Please help us. During the upcoming fundraiser, we hope you will encourage every student to give *just one dollar*. There's no pressure and no competition. Just this dare: are you willing to believe that YOU can make the world a better place? If you are, then it *will* be.

What has ODFL done in just its first four years? It's *amazing!* We...

- 2007 Built a new school for 45 students in the village of Naro Moru in Kenya.
- 2007 Raised 6,000 pounds of food at Thanksgiving for the Second Harvest Food Bank.
- 2008 Built a 3 room school in Nepal for 84 students who were going to class under a tree.
- 2008 Bought 60 desks for the Kisimu village primary school in Malawi.
- 2008 Built a new classroom for the Ngenia Mixed Secondary School in Timau, Kenya.
- 2008 Bought 2 milk cows to feed protein to 120 orphans in Nanyuki, Kenya.
- 2008 Collected and sent 452 bicycles to Africa—our “Wheels of Wonder” bicycle drive.
- 2008 Raised \$3,000 to help student victims of the China earthquake.
- 2008 Bought 20 piglets to save 20 Nepalese girls from being sold into slavery.
- 2008 & 2009 Sent more than 500 pairs of tennis shoes to students in Malawi and Kenya.
- 2009 Built an engineered latrine system for the Kiini Secondary School in Nyeri, Kenya.
- 2009 Built a new classroom for the village of San Martin in Nicaragua.
- 2009 Renovated a classroom and community center in the village of Ban in Indonesia.
- 2009 Built a new classroom for 40 students at the Mureru District Day School in Kenya.
- 2010 Raised \$20,000 for relief projects for the victims of the Jan. 2010 Haiti earthquake.
- 2010 Built a new classroom for the Gakawa District Day School in Nanyuki, Kenya.
- 2010 Built a new classroom for the Santa Isabel village in El Salvador.

All of this was made possible by *one-dollar donations* from tens of thousands of American students, and the volunteer efforts of many teachers. And because ODFL is run by teachers and student volunteers, every dollar a student gives goes into a developing world project.
